Easy Picture Book


We are Definitely Human by X. Fang



There's no "Take us to your leader!" demands in this laugh-out-loud book about extraterrestrials who've crashed on Earth. Their vehicle (i.e. spaceship) is experiencing technical difficulties and they need help. When they see Mr. Li, who ran from his bed at the crash noise, they chorus "Hello. We are DEFINITELY human." Though Mr. Li has his suspicions (the 3 aliens are shaped like a muffin, a Kong dog toy, and a modern-art vase), he takes them in and offers support. During polite conversation, it is discovered the 3 guests are "from...Europe," and their occupations are "make business," "play sportsball," and "wear hat." No matter, the town is happy to help without judgement, because that's what kind humans do.

Easy Picture Book

Tumblebaby by Adam Rex & Audrey Helen Weber



Have you ever known the acute agony of a child asking you to tell them a story? No, not a story from a book!! A story you made up...right now. Cue the nervous sweats. This adorable tale has the feel of a parent who is half-asleep, over-dosed on fairy and folk tales, and grasping at straws. And that's what makes it so unique and sweet. Tumblebaby just won't stay still, much to his parent's chagrin. So when he/she rolls out the door, it's the beginning of a grand adventure involving scoundrels, coyotes, the Winter Olympics and more! Tumblebaby tumbles serenely through it all, returning at last to his parent's welcoming arms. And guess what? That Tumblebaby was you. Only you don't remember.

Young Adult Graphic Novel

Youth Group by Bowen McCurdy & Jordan Norris



Set in the 90s, this oddball graphic novel features Kay, a nonbeliever who begrudgingly attends church to please her mom. This is a hip church... a church that sings the "Pina Colada" song during worship in a modern mega-building. Sent to youth group, Kay meets Meg Parks, the bubbly, overlyenthusiastic, barely-out-of-her-teens assistant leader. Welcoming but not pushy, Meg and Kay connect over Kay's parents ongoing divorce. Later, as Kay vents to her best friend in the woods, she hears noises at a remote cabin and goes to investigate. Peering through the window, she sees Meg and the other youth group leaders battling a....demon?! Turns out, this is their side job...and they need more help...from Kay...who *surprise* is a "blight", capable of defeating powerful demons. Somehow this crazy story manages to avoid major sacrilege while showcasing family members and friends who respect and accept each other's beliefs and maintain loving relationships. Hand this book to any teens who would dare call youth group boring!


