The Attack on Pearl Harbor


Presented by Mike Jesberger

Teen/YA Fiction


Thunder City by Philip Reeve



Philip Reeve's Mortal Engines series is an OG of steampunk YA lit. Perhaps you've seen the film? In Thunder City, you'll reenter the noisy and odorous dystopia that is what remains of Earth. Although recognizable landmarks like London and Paris appear, you definitely won't recognize them. Most of the land on Earth is abandoned, and cities exist either on giant traction wheels, suspended in the sky, or floating upon the swamps. And they're carnivorous, even cannibalistic...surviving by swallowing up smaller towns and hamlets and dismantling them for parts and valuables. Our heroine, Tamsin Pook, has spent much of her life as an enslaved gladiator in an entertainment arcade, battling mechanical monsters created by the arcade's cruel master. And she's good at it, a celebrity, in fact. One day, a very determined lady tutor arrives with a bizarre request. Help her track down the heir to the mayorship of a mid-size city that has been seized by nefarious forces. Then she'll be free to go wherever she likes. Of course, when massive mobile cities, dangerous automatons, and octopus spies (not to mention money) are involved, things can get a little crazy.

Pea Green Crayon battles a mighty abomination, while Peach Crayon (aka Baron Naked Von Nuddington) investigates clues in a mystery board game. But fret not, they all happily return from their adventures for a dandy dinner party.

Mickey Mouse and the Amazing Lost Ocean
by Denis-Pierre Filippi & Silvin Camboni



I'm a sucker for beautiful illustrations...and this book has them in spades. Mickey Mouse? Meh. Over it. BUT...what about Mickey, Minnie, Goofy and nemesis Pete in an intricately detailed, vibrantly colored alternate reality? Mickey, Minnie and Goofy are partners in a salvage business, hunting rare fuel in the ocean to survive. Pete is their main competitor, always showing up to steal their finds or spy on their inventions. When Goofy enters them in a contest to design tech capable of raising inaccessible treasure, the race is on. But who/what is at the true center of this contest and why? After a bizarre accident, Mickey is thrown into a coma for 5 years, waking to an altered world. The strangest part of this new world may be that Pete is now on their side and part of their team! Can the disaster be reversed? Aw shucks, they're sure gonna try! This visual feast will entrance much older kids (like, maybe even adults) with the adventures of three of the most recognizable characters in the world.


